OECD 471, Under the conditions of the study, 2-ethyl-1,3,3-trimethyl-2-norbornanol was considered to be non-mutagenic with and without metabolic activation in E. coli strain WP2uvrA at concentrations up to and including 5000 ug/plate, the highest concentration tested.

Result: Not mutagenic.

OECD 471, Under the conditions of the study, 2-ethyl-1,3,3-trimethyl-2-norbornanol was mutagenic in S. typhimurium strain TA1535 in the confirmatory assay at concentrations of 1600 (6.8--fold increase in revertant colony numbers relative to vehicle control), 3300 (13.0-fold increase), and 5000 ug/plate (10.4-fold increase), in the presence of S9 mix. This positive response was reproducible, occurring in both the initial and confirmatory assays. A 3.3-fold increase in revertant colony numbers occurred with strain TA1535 in the initial assay at a concentration of 1600 ug/plate in the absence of S9 mix, surpassing the ≥ 3 -fold increase threshold required for a positive mutagenic response. No increase in numbers of revertant colonies was observed at the next highest concentration of 5000 ug/plate in this assay in the absence of S9 mix, although this concentration was obviously cytotoxic. However, there was no increase in revertant colony numbers at 1600, 3300, or 5000 ug/plate in the confirmatory assay in the absence of S9 mix, despite a positive response at these concentration in the presence of S9 mix. Therefore, the response was not reproducible and will not be included in the final summary as evidence of mutagenicity under these experimental conditions. Revertant colony counts were not increased relative to vehicle control with strains TA98, TA100, or TA1537 at concentrations up to and including 500 ug/plate (strains TA100 and TA1537, with and/or without S9 mix) and 5000 ug/plate (strain TA98, with and without S9 mix), the highest evaluable concentrations tested. Toxic effects occurred with all S. typhimurium strains at 500-5000 ug/plate in the presence and absence of S9 mix.
